The new CACFP regulations establishes early education age groups as infant-5 months, 6-11 months, 1-2 year olds, and 3-5 year olds. These improvements are expected to enhance the quality of meals served to young children. Early care and education programs had until October 1, 2017 to be in compliance with new CACFP Meal Pattern Revisions.

After each screening, remove and discard PPE, and wash hands. Use an alcohol-based hand

For-Profit Child Care Centers: All for-profit centers must have at least 25% of their enrollment or

licensed capacity, whichever is less, at the free or reduced reimbursement rate. See if you qualify by having parents complete income eligibility forms before starting an application.
