Story Map - STRATEGIES

Story maps can be organized in a variety of ways, but typically include story characters, setting, problem, and solution (Jennings, Caldwell, Lerner, 2014). Story maps can also include plot and theme. Simple story maps might involve younger students in describing what happens at the beginning, middle, and end of a story.

Story Maps - Strategies for Students

This story map diagram prompts the student to summarize describe the setting, the characters, the problem, three major events, and the solution. Simple Book Report Printout This graphic organizer prompts the student to write about the characters, setting, and events of a story.
